He joined us on Go West trips before he married Amy—and 4 trips with her where they shared our “honeymoon quarters,” a petite double bed that’s smaller than a regular single bed & wedged right behind the driver’s seat! David knew what he was getting into: a tiny bed, an awesome adventure in marriage and a world vision to share the love of Christ with international students. Specializing in transportation, David saw the benefit of taking students anywhere our bus would go. Once we took 2 buses from Atlanta to the Grand Canyon, LA, up Pacific Coast Highway 1 to San Francisco, the Redwoods, Crater Lake and Washington. There 1 bus got new students to join the other bus for Yellowstone, the Badlands, and on back to Atlanta while the other group under David’s leadership stayed 3 extra days in the NW before flying home. The price for either air & bus or roundtrip bus was the same low price. Why? Because we’ve never sought to make a profit from our bus trips, just enough to cover the cost of transportation. In fact, our drivers have never taken a penny of salary. The current uniquely designed sleeper coach bus we use for these “cross-country, cross-cultural treks that carry the cross of Christ” is now 30 years old. And in honor of David Walters, we’re building a newer sleeper bus to last the next 10 years of ministry.
